From the Pastor's Desk... Inspired by John 4:5-15

Take a moment and recall the time in your life when you suffered most terribly from thirst. Think back to when you were hot as you have never been before. You were exhausted, utterly worn out from heat and smoke; you were parched, utterly thirsty.

Where were you? Was your area plagued suddenly by a freakishly hot streak, or were you traveling? Was the heat thick and moist, filled with unreleased water, or was it a sultry dry heat, sapping your skin, nose and mouth of their last reserves of moisture? Were you in a desert? Was it a barren place, of wind and dune and bleached rocks, or did it have spindly shrubs, flat spruces, distant hills?

The distance Jesus and his friends were walking, from Judea near Jerusalem to Galilee was about 50 miles. The well of Sychar was about half way. We read that when they arrived, Jesus was tired by the journey and he sat down. And no wonder! It was the heat of the day and stiflingly hot. They would have been walking since the cool of dawn, and it was lunchtime. They had no food. At least there was a well, where thirst could be quenched. But without a bucket, Jesus couldn't down the water. So he waited until a local came by; then, without even saying "please," he told the stranger to give him some. She was shocked, perhaps a bit put-off, and probably thirsty herself. So there they were; at the same time, but both thirsty. But Jesus' thirst was different from the woman's. Water would remove his. Then, when thirsty again, he would drink again. The thirst he saw in her, however, was not temporary. It was not caused by heat, desert, or empty winds. It was the thirst of a body of tenderness, for passion, for appreciation. It was the thirst of a quick-witted theological mind for truths that would not waiver with debate, for teaching that would hot teeter by intimidation. And it was the thirst of a spirit for that refreshment, that living water that would never cease.

No, this woman's thirst was not temporary. It came from God, and only God could relieve it. The thirst was total; it was the intense longing of the whole human creature to know and be known, to love and be loved, to satisfy and be satisfied. Jesus recognized this thirst! "If you only knew what God is offering," Jesus tells us, "you would ask and God would give you living water."

Council Approves Use of Facility

The Church Council at its July meeting approved entering into a fellowship with the Village of Grace, a Christian community in Orange. They will have use of the sanctuary from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on Sundays beginning September 11, 2016. In addition, they will use a classroom from 9:15 to 10:15 Sunday mornings beginning 9/11/2016. Beginning August 3, 2016, they will use the Fireside Room for Bible Study on Wednesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30. The monthly contribution for use of the sanctuary, a classroom, and the Fireside Room as stated above will be \$1000 a month, increasing to \$1250 after 9 months, and to \$1800 after 18 months. In addition, they will provide quarterly service projects to be determined. The August payment for use of the Fireside Room only will be \$333. The cost for use of the entire facility in September (3 Sundays) will be \$750. A contract and insurance will be required. This contract will be subject to review after 6 months.
